



IPAD PROTECTION PLAN NEW FEE FOR 2022-2023 SCHOOL YEAR

Faribault Public Schools recognizes that the implementation of a 1:1 technology learning initiative requires a need to protect the investment by both the district and families. Faribault Public Schools is offering an iPad Protection Plan to help cover the cost of accidental breakage or damage. Enrollment in the plan is optional.

At the start of the 2022-23 school year, 6th-12th grade students will take iPads home, 5th grade students will gain more home access through the year, and students 4th grade and younger will not take iPads home. Therefore we are offering participation in an iPad protection plan for students in grades 5-12. This plan is an annual payment of \$10 with a maximum family cap of \$40 and covers one accidental damage per device per year. More information is available on our website under departments/technology, as well as in our iPad Loan Agreement.

IPad payments can be made online through the Infinite Campus portal starting August 10, 2022.

BUS INFORMATION

If you are new to Faribault Public Schools, have moved, have changes to your daycare or added daycare, or changed schools, please call Faribault Transportation at 334–5121 so we can ensure that your child is on the correct bus route. Busing eligibility includes K-12 public and parochial students who live one mile or further from school, and school-aged handicapped students. Also eligible are students in grades K-3 who have hazardous crossings. Call 333–6000 if you have questions regarding your busing eligibility.

BUSING GUIDELINES:

- Students in grades K-1 who are eligible for bus transportation will receive one bus identification card in August. This card will include the student's name, address, school, and grade so they can easily be identified by supervisors and bus drivers.
- If a student moves or loses his/her identification card, parents can make a card with the student's information and attach it to the student's back pack.
- Students must ride the assigned bus to and from school; there are no exceptions. Bus stops are established by school district administration.
- Please remember, school bus transportation is a privilege, not a right.
- Families are required to designate one pick-up site in the morning (am) and one drop-off site in the evening (pm).
- Students will be transported to those sites only.
- Requests to ride different buses or to get off at unassigned addresses make it difficult
 for students, teachers, parents, and Faribault Transportation to know where each child
 is and should be. Seats are often unavailable for students attempting to ride unassigned
 buses; and each bus must adhere to a legal load count. Consistency in ridership helps
 our bus drivers get to know each student on his/her bus. This requirement also helps
 avoid miscommunication and confusion, and ensures the safety of all riders.

The decision to keep schools open or closed during winter weather is made with the well-being and safety of our students and families in mind. We take into consideration students time outside walking to school or waiting at the bus stop.

The decision to delay, release early or close schools is made from weighing several factors:

- If road conditions and bus travel is unsafe, roads are driven and checked by the bus company and school personnel during inclement weather.
- Wind chill temperatures
- Excessive snow accumulations

During the winter season, always be sure to dress your child warmly for the bus stop or the walk to school. Buses may occasionally be delayed with bus pickup times due to weather conditions and bus stops may need to be modified depending on road conditions in your area.

Decisions to close or delay schools will be made as soon as possible. Please look for announcements the day before a winter storm or by 6:00am the day of the closing or delay of school. Please refrain from calling the schools and check the notification sources on page 12.







DRIVER EDUCATION



THE BASICS

- Students may enroll at 14 years of age, but they must be 15 to take the permit test.
- This course consists of the state-required 30 hours of classroom instruction and six hours of Behind-the-Wheel. The classroom prepares students for the written permit test. Upon completion of the classroom and obtaining a driver's permit, the Driver Education Coordinator schedules Behind-the-Wheel. The Behind-the-Wheel component prepares students for the road test.
- A student is required to have their permit for six months and be 16 years of age before they are eligible to take the road test for their driver's license.

COST

Driver Education costs are are \$410.00. Costs can break down to two payments, \$160 at registration and \$250 before classes start. Payment in full is required one week prior to class start date. If payment is not received one week prior to class, registration will be canceled and a drop fee will be applied prior to your refund.

- The cost for taking classroom elsewhere and taking six hours of Behind-the-Wheel sessions with Faribault Community Education is \$300.
- Money will be forfeited for:
 - Discipline reasons, or failure to complete the requirements of the course
 - Missing two or more days of class
- If you fail to attend the class you are registered for:
 - A drop/add fee of \$50 will be assessed to register for another class
 - If money is refunded, \$50 will be subtracted from the registration fee




